

To reach everyone with safely managed sanitation services (SDG 6.2), a range of options are required from centrally treated sewerage to more decentralized, non-networked options.

Given the history of sewers and their link to modernization, sanitation plans often focus on sewer upgrades and drainages rather than services that enable the existing non-networked systems to function over the long-term. Services such as emptying, fecal sludge

treatment, and proper disposal or reuse that form part of the solution are often under-resourced and difficult to realize.

Today non-networked systems serve approximately 40% of all households globally (JMP). The management of these systems must be prioritized to reach everyone, especially the most vulnerable. Furthermore, behind the management there need to be people with the relevant knowledge, skills, and motivation to realize these services.



Non-networked sanitation solutions are indispensable to achieve Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 6: access to sanitation facilities for everyone by 2030
